There has been a great deal to celebrate with teams heading off to compete in multiple activities - a huge congratulation to our PCT Team of Ezekiel, Vanessa and Mackenzie who represented Whanganui at the national competition in Auckland placing second (by just 1 second)!

We also had a small team represent our school at the contributing schools athletics yesterday - our results have been remarkable. The thing that makes us so proud of our kids is when they head away they show our values of PRIDE. Our end of year assessments are complete and we are super proud of the
