Relationship and Sexuality Education

We will be holding a whānau hui on **Thursday 26 October at 5.30pm** to discuss the upcoming programme to support our learners.

Our school has chosen to use Family Planning's resource *Navigating the Journey: Relationships and Sexuality Education* and *Keeping Ourselves Safe* (NZ Police) to assist with their delivery of a comprehensive, age-appropriate RSE programme. These resources were created alongside educational and health promotion experts to ensure that all of the material aligns with the Ministry of Education's guidance.

RSE is an important component of the health and physical education learning area of the curriculum. While some may see the word sexuality and think that this part of the curriculum is only relevant to older students, RSE is actually a comprehensive and holistic programme that covers many topics. For younger learners, these topics include life skills, identity, respect, friendships and feelings, as well as the biological topic such as body parts and how reproduction works.
